## Disciplinary Hearings

**SCOTT GREGORY LILLY, MD** – Defendant's Motion to Modify Order of Suspension - *Board authorized Board Secretary to execute correspondence to OBN advising of no restrictions for Dr. Lilly to apply for an OBN permit; Motion to Modify withdrawn*

**DARNELL ERIC BLACKMON, SR., MD** – Defendant's Second Motion to Terminate Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction – *Granted pending review and approval of the Oklahoma Attorney General*

**RICHARD JAY JOHNS, PT** – Motion for Default Judgment – *Granted pending review and approval of the Oklahoma Attorney General*

**SARA ANN COLLIER, MD** – Disciplinary hearing based on allegations of the violation, or attempted violation, direct or indirect, of any of the provisions of the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act, either as principal, accessory or accomplice; dishonorable or immoral conduct which is likely to deceive, defraud, or harm the public; confession of a crime involving violation of the antinarcotic laws of the federal government or the laws of this state; violation of any state or Federal law or regulation relating to controlled substances; habitual intemperance or the habitual use of habit-forming drugs and/or the habitual or excessive use of any drug which impairs the ability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to the patient; the writing of false or fictitious prescriptions for any drugs or narcotics declared by the laws of this state to be controlled or narcotic drugs; the use of any false, fraudulent, or deceptive statement in any document connected with the practice of medicine and surgery; prescribing, selling, administering, distributing, ordering, or giving any drug legally classified as a controlled substance or recognized as an addictive dangerous drug to a family member or to himself or herself; prescribing or administering a drug or treatment without sufficient examination and the establishment of a valid physician-patient relationship; and prescribing, dispensing or administering of controlled substances or narcotic drugs in excess of the amount considered good medical practice, or prescribing, dispensing or administering controlled substances or narcotic drugs without medical need in accordance with published standards – *Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction accepted pending review and approval of the Oklahoma Attorney General*

**MOHEB HALLABA, MD** – Possible Motion for Default Judgment; possible Motion to Continue; *and, dependent upon the Board's ruling on the motions, a potential disciplinary hearing based on allegations of violation of any provision(s) of the medical practice act or the rules and regulations of the Board; engaging in dishonorable or immoral conduct which is likely to deceive defraud or harm the public; prescribing or administering a drug or*

treatment without sufficient examination and the establishment of a valid physician-patient relationship; aiding or abetting the practice of medicine and surgery by an unlicensed person; prescribing, dispensing or administering of controlled substances or narcotic drugs in excess of the amount considered good medical practice, or prescribing, dispensing or administering controlled substances or narcotic drugs without medical need in accordance with published standards; failure to maintain an office record for each patient which accurately reflects the evaluation, treatment, and medical necessity of treatment of the patient; Indiscriminate or excessive prescribing, dispensing or administering of Controlled or Narcotic drugs; allowing another person or organization to use a physician's license to practice medicine and surgery; purchasing or prescribing any regulated substance in Schedule I through V, as defined by the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, for the physician's personal use; prescribing, selling, administering, distributing, ordering, or giving any drug legally classified as a controlled substance or recognized as an addictive dangerous drug to a family member or to himself or herself, provided that this paragraph shall not apply to family members outside the second degree of consanguinity or affinity; violating any state or federal law or regulation relating to controlled substances; and failure to check the PMP system (and notating same in the patient file) at least once every six months when prescribing opioids, benzodiazepines, or carisoprodol in order to assess medical necessity and the possibility that the patient may be unlawfully obtaining prescription drugs – *Agreement not to Practice accepted and case continued to January 17, 2019*

**RICHARD JAMES WEDEL, MD** – Disciplinary hearing on allegations of violation of any provision(s) of the medical practice act or the rules and regulations of the Board; making a misrepresentation in applying for or procuring a medical license or in connection with applying for or procuring periodic re-registration of a medical license; the inability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of age, illness, drunkenness, excessive use of drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or any other type of material or as a result of any mental or physical condition. In enforcing this subsection the Board may, upon probable cause, request a physician to submit to a mental or physical examination by physicians designated by it; dishonorable or immoral conduct which is likely to deceive, defraud, or harm the public; confession of a crime involving violation of the laws of this state; and habitual intemperance or the habitual use of habit-forming drugs – *Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction accepted pending review and approval of the Oklahoma Attorney General*

**LEE RITTENHOUSE, MD** – Agreed Motion to Continue Deadlines and Hearing to Next Board Meeting, and, dependent upon the Board's ruling on the Motion to Continue, a potential disciplinary hearing on allegations of prescribing or administering a drug or treatment without sufficient examination and the establishment of a valid physician-patient relationship; violation, or attempted violation, direct or indirect, of any of the provisions of the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act, either as a principal, accessory or accomplice; aiding or abetting, directly or indirectly, the practice of medicine by any person not duly authorized under the laws of this state; failure to maintain an office record for each patient which accurately reflects the

evaluation, treatment, and medical necessity of treatment of the patient; and failure to establish a physician/patient relationship prior to providing patient-specific medical services, care or treatment, except in a clearly emergent, life threatening situation – *Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction accepted pending review and approval of the Oklahoma Attorney General*
