**RULEMAKING ACTION:**

Notice of proposed PERMANENT rulemaking

**PROPOSED RULE:**

Subchapter 1. Administration and Organization

435:70-1-4. Therapeutic Recreation Committee – terms of members – removal from Committee [AMENDED]

**PURPOSE OF PROPOSED RULE:**

The proposed revision is requested so that a committee member who has served three consecutive terms may serve an additional term(s) if such member is willing and able to serve and is re-appointed by the Oklahoma Medical Board of Licensure and Supervision.

**CLASSES AFFECTED:**

The classes of persons who most likely will be affected by the proposed rule amendment are therapeutic recreation specialists.

**PERSONS BENEFITTED:**

The classes of persons who will benefit from the proposed amendment will be therapeutic recreation specialists and their patients by having advisory board continuity.

**PROBABLE ECONOMIC IMPACT:**

1. On affected classes: There will be little or no economic impact due to the proposed change in this rule.

2. On political subdivision: There will be little or no impact due to the proposed change in this rule.

3. Fees: The proposed rule change does not address agency fees.

**PROBABLE COST TO THE AGENCY:**

Minimal administrative only. No additional personnel or budget expenses are anticipated.

**WILL THE RULE IMPACT POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS:**

No economic impact, or a need for cooperation from political subdivisions, is anticipated.

**SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT:**

There is no anticipated adverse impact on small business, with reference to Sections 303 (A) (4) and 304 (b) (6) of the APA.

**ALTERNATIVE METHODS AND COSTS OF COMPLIANCE:**

There are no apparent alternative methods for compliance. The Agency does not anticipate any additional costs of administration due to implementation of these rule changes.

**PUBLIC HEALTH/ SAFETY CONCERNS:**

There will be no adverse impact or concerns with public safety or environment that will result for this proposed rule change.
