INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING SPECIAL VOLUNTEER MEDICAL LICENSE

A physician who is retired from active practice and wishes to donate his/her expertise for the medical care and treatment of the indigent and needy persons in the State of Oklahoma may apply for a Special Volunteer Medical License.

Eligibility:

In order to be eligible for a Special Volunteer Medical License you must:

- 1. Be retired from active practice (Oklahoma license must be inactive);
- 2. Have previously been issued a full and unrestricted license in Oklahoma or another state:
- 3. Have never been the subject of disciplinary action;
- 4. Only provide medical care to needy and indigent persons in Oklahoma or persons in medically underserved areas in Oklahoma; and
- 5. Not receive or have the expectation to receive any payment or compensation, either direct or indirect, for any medical services provided. (Note: You may want to contact your attorney to verify what would constitute direct or indirect payment or compensation.)

Application Requirements:

- 1. Completed Application.
- 2. Form #1, Verification of Education, and notarized copy of diploma must be completed and submitted (unless you previously held an Oklahoma medical license) by the medical school from which you graduated.
- 3. Form #3, Verification of Licensure, must be completed and submitted by every state that has ever issued you a medical license.
- 4. Volunteer Practice Setting Information form must be completed, signed and notarized.

General Information:

- 1. There are no fees associated with the Special Volunteer Medical License (initial application or renewal).
- 2. The Special Volunteer Medical License must be renewed annually with Board approval.
- 3. There are no continuing medical education requirements for the Special Volunteer Medical License.
- 4. There is no guarantee that a full, unrestricted license may be issued in the future, whether or not a Special Volunteer Medical License is issued.
